Comedy. Two days before Christmas, Santa is missing. Mrs Claus hires private eye Spam Slade to solve the case.



To pay your membership for **Act 1 Theatre**, please go to

At the site you will be asked to choose a seat in a fictional 900 seat event called

'Act1 Theatre Membership 2024'.

The seat you choose will be your membership number and nothing more. It does not entitle you to a specific seat allocation when booking show tickets.

<u>PLEASE NOTE</u>: Fully Paid-up Members receive a <u>Membership</u>**Number** to be put in the provided space when making a booking for a show to secure your ticket at Membership Discount price.

Remember, you can only use your number for your own ticket. Full price must be paid for non-members. Payment may be demanded on arrival at the theatre if a membership number has been misused.

Membership Information

Membership renewals for 2024 are due from the 1st of January. Membership is \$20 (Full rate); \$15 (Concession cardholders).

Go to the TryBooking link in the box above. If unable to use this, alternatives are:

Option A: If no one can assist you (i.e. family or friend) to follow the procedure, contact Andrew on 0413759741 and have a debit/credit card handy and he will walk you through the process.

Option B: You can renew your membership at the theatre when you come to see the first show of the year. You can purchase tickets to the first show at the membership rate using your 2023 membership number, but you must renew your membership for 2024 when you arrive. There will be a membership officer to process your renewal/new membership on duty and you can pay by EFT or cash.

Continuing members do not need to complete a membership form. Be sure to let us know of any changes to your details.

Encourage your friends to join Act 1.

Act 1 members receive our monthly newsletter (which will cease end of March if not financial) and a significant discount on tickets to Act 1 shows and at Mousetrap, Sandgate and KSP theatres.

THE WORST SHOW

This was the 'Intimate Review' which opened and closed at the Duchess Theatre, London on March 11th, 1930. When the curtain rose, the stage was so cluttered that there was hardly any space for the actors. Each sketch had so much scenery that any set change took up to 20 minutes. The review was intimate, according to The Times critic, 'because we were always getting glimpses of things we were not meant to. Every time the curtains parted, squads of scene-shifters might be seen in action or in horrid precipitate flight.'

When this happened the first time, it was amusing; but when it happened every time a sketch started, audience hysteria set in. Each time the curtains opened, there were the scene shifters, as horrified as before. They looked up like terrified moles disturbed by torchlight and raced once more for the safety of the wings.

Then came Miss Florence McHugh's totally incomprehensible 'Hawaiian Idyll' in which, dressed as a dusky maiden, she paced the beach, hymning the pains of love. All would have been well except that, clearly visible through a transparent blue backdrop, two scene-shifting monsters were at war in the sea behind her.

At this rate, the finale would have been on stage at about dawn, so the management moved straight to the final number. Six dancers, meant to represent Greek nymphs, lumbered hither and thither as best they could beneath the weight of monstrously large head-dresses. In one inspired manoeuvre two of the head-dresses became entangled, leaving Miss Florence McHugh, whose bravery was agreed upon by all the critics the next morning, to sing the closing song, while other nymphs tried to untangle the unfortunate pair.

Next day the Manchester Guardian critic wrote: 'Spectators returned to their seats to be in at the death, to laugh with the conquered, not at them, and give a sporting cheer. Thumbs up or thumbs down? Who cares? Our good humour is restored. The show takes its final breath and, with a death rattle, expires. Enough!' That afternoon the cast sent a brief statement to the Evening Standard: 'Everyone concerned was so much in agreement with the criticism of last night's performance that its closure was decided upon promptly. In regard to the accommodation on stage, there was certainly an appearance of overcrowding.'

They apologized to the audience, blamed the lack of rehearsal, and promised to re-open later in the year.
